

GUIDANCE FOR FOREIGN TRAVELLERS ARRIVING AT JOHANNESBURG INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT, KNOWN AS OR TAMBO INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT (ORTIA), TO GET TO THE RAR2018 VENUE AT KRUGER GATE PROTEA HOTEL

The information provided is guidance and the organisers of RAR2018 cannot take responsibility for incorrect or incomplete information. Please note that the VAT changes from 14% to 15% on 1 April 2018, so any reference to 14% in the prior documentation will change.

The conference venue is located on the border of the Kruger National Park, just outside the boundary fence, but such that we can view game sitting on the hotel verandah. The hotel is about 430 km by road from the airport, and this will take about 5 hours by road. A location map is available on the hotel website

There are several alternatives for travelling to the conference venue, namely:

Travel by air from ORTIA to either Skukuza airport or Kruger International Airport (KIA) at Nelspruit and then take a shuttle to the hotel.

Take a shuttle from ORTIA to the conference hotel.

Air travel from ORTIA to Skukuza or KIA Nelspruit

The Skukuza airport is 18 km from the venue and KIA is about 100 km away.

The published airline schedules are given in Appendix A. Indicative costs, depending on the ticket, are:

Johannesburg – Nelspruit – Johannesburg Ranging from: R2 600-00 to R4 800-00 return

Johannesburg – Skukuza – Johannesburg Ranging from: R3 700-00 to R4 900-00 return

Prices quoted are subject to availability.

Shuttle costs for the service offered by the hotel are given in Appendix B. Note that arriving and departing from Skukuza incur a conservancy cost as shown in Appendix B.

Travel by road

The road from ORTIA to the venue is a high quality paved road. Since the road passes through populated areas over the last 60 km before the venue, it is not recommended to travel after dark as people and animals make driving challenging. This means that delegates should not leave ORTIA after noon, and this will also ensure that if the trip is made on the Tuesday that delegates will be able to participate in the ice-breaker function.

The hotel can arrange a shuttle and the prices are given in Appendix B. Another service provider, Penguin Tours (info@penquintours.com) can offer a one-way shuttle for 1 to 3 persons for R5556.00.

Delegates planning to travel by shuttle can inform Jacqui (satc.conference@gmail.com) should they wish to try and combine with other travellers to make a larger group. Information such as airline arrival time and shuttle preferences should be provided, but success of combining travellers cannot be guaranteed.

Travel Tips, Health and Safety and Recommended Reading

Health and Safety

South Africa has a well-developed healthcare system. There are public hospitals throughout South Africa, but as in many other countries, you'll probably get quicker care at a private hospital. Be sure to top up on medical insurance before leaving home. Well-qualified doctors, dentists and other specialists can be found in the main centres but you will have to make an appointment to see one, unless it's an emergency.

Malaria: While most of South Africa is malaria-free, this mosquito-borne disease is prevalent throughout the year in the Kruger National Park and the low-lying areas of northern KwaZulu-Natal.

Consult a healthcare professional about a suitable prophylactic. Your choice of drug will depend on how long you are visiting the malarial area, the time of year and your personal health.

The old adage 'prevention is the best cure' also holds true. Use repellent and cover up at dawn and dusk when the mosquitoes are most active by wearing long pants, long-sleeved shirts, and shoes and socks, if possible.

There are many malaria-free game reserves, such as Madikwe or Pilanesberg in North West province, the Waterberg in Limpopo, or private reserves in the Eastern, Western and Northern Cape, where you can also have a wildlife experience. These are worth considering, particularly if you are travelling with children aged six and under or are pregnant.

TRAVEL TIP: If you develop a bad headache, have aching joints, and recurring fevers and chills after your trip, advise your doctor that you have been in a malarial area. Malaria symptoms can sometimes be confused with flu symptoms.

HIV/Aids: While southern Africa has a high prevalence of HIV/Aids, your only real risk of contracting this syndrome is if you have unprotected sex with an infected individual. There should be no reason for unprotected sex as condoms are freely available in pharmacies and convenience stores. Antiretrovirals are issued free to rape victims at South African hospitals. Should you be the victim of a sexual assault, it's essential that you get prophylactic treatment for HIV/Aids within 72 hours.

Personal medication: There are pharmacies throughout South Africa, and many everyday medications, such as painkillers, are available over the counter. Some large chain stores, like Clicks, also have in-store pharmacies that offer good value for money.

If you have a specific medical condition, it's wise to carry the relevant doctor's prescription with you. In the event of you losing your medication, a qualified pharmacist should be able to source a replacement, even if the trade name differs in South Africa.

Personal safety

For tourists, South Africa is as safe as any other destination in the world. South Africa boasts a vast array of cultures, communities, sites and attractions. Most parts of the country can be safely visited by tourists provided they take basic common-sense precautions (for example not walking alone in deserted areas at night and being circumspect about how much photographic equipment or flashy jewellery you carry). Most of the crime that takes place in South Africa is between people who know each other and random acts of violence make up a very small minority of cases. Most major cities run organized crime prevention programmes. Basic Safety Tip guidelines will be available at hotels and tourism information offices.

If you are in doubt as to the safety of a particular area or attraction, contact the National Tourism information and Safety Line on +27 (0) 83 123 2345. This number may also be used for practical assistance in replacing lost documents or reporting incidents.

Food and water

As a rule, tap water in South Africa is safe to drink as it is treated and is free of harmful micro-organisms. In hotels, restaurants and nightspots, the standards of hygiene and food preparation are top-notch. It is safe to eat fresh fruit and salads and to put as much ice as you like in your drinks.

Road safety

Our transport infrastructure is excellent and our roads are in good condition. However, the distances between towns are significant, so if you're planning to self-drive, it is a good idea to plan your itinerary to ensure you don't drive long distances as fatigue is a major cause of road accidents. Avoid long car journeys that necessitate driving at night as it always carries more risk. Also, in some of the more remote rural areas, the roads are not fenced so there may be stray animals on the road.

South Africa has very strict drinking and driving laws - with a maximum allowable alcohol blood content of 0.05%. Translated that means about one glass of wine for the average woman and perhaps 1.5 or two for the average or large man. Our speed limits are 120kmph on the open road, 100km/h on smaller roads and between 60 and 80 km/h in towns. Be aware that even major national roads cut through residential areas so there may be a speed limit of 80 or 60 km/h on a road that looks like an autobahn.

Whatever the temptation to do so, it is not advisable or permissible to pay cash to traffic officers but rather to accept the fine given to you with a good grace. Corruption only leads to more corruption!

Vaccinations

Visitors entering South Africa from a yellow fever zone must have a valid international yellow fever inoculation certificate. Only infants under the age of one year are exempt. Immunisation against cholera and smallpox are not required nor are any other vaccinations.

Travel Tips

Time Differences

South Africa operates two hours ahead of Greenwich Mean Time throughout the year, making it an hour ahead of Central European Winter Time, seven hours ahead of Eastern Standard Winter Time and seven hours behind Australian Central Time.

Getting there

OR Tambo International Airport (Johannesburg – airport code JNB) is the major airport in South Africa and is the hub for 45 airlines from five continents. Flights from Europe are generally overnight and just a sleep. The direct flights between the USA and Johannesburg or Cape Town are about 15 hours, and flights between London and Johannesburg take about 12 hours.

Passports and Visas

For the majority of foreign nationals who travel to South Africa for vacation, entry is straightforward and hassle-free. All visitors to South Africa must be in possession of a valid passport in order to enter the country, and in some cases, a visa. It is advisable to ensure that your passport is valid for 6 months beyond your intended departure date from South Africa at the end of your holiday.

Travellers from certain regions of the world (Scandinavia, Japan, the USA, and most Western European and Commonwealth countries) do not need to formally apply for a visa. Upon arrival in South Africa, citizens of countries falling into this category will automatically be given a free entry permit sticker that outlines how long they may remain in the country. This automatic entry permit is usually for a maximum of 90 days, though the immigration officer may tailor the time period according to the airline tickets held. Foreign nationals from some other countries are offered this service, but for a maximum of 30 days. Visitors wishing to stay longer have to apply formally for a visa, as opposed to relying on the automatic entry permit.

For the majority of foreign nationals who travel to South Africa for vacation, entry is straightforward and hassle-free. All visitors to South Africa must be in possession of a valid passport in order to enter the country, and in some cases, a visa. However, it is important to note that under South Africa's Immigration Act of 2002 (Act. 13 of 2002) in force since 7 April 2003, the passport must contain at least ONE unused page when presenting the passport for endorsements. These requirements reflect those of many of the world's top travel destinations, in line with the majority of global destinations' requirements and failure to have a clear page can result in entry being refused.

Banks and Money

The currency unit is the Rand, denoted by the symbol R before the numbers. There are 100 cents (100c) in R1 (one Rand). Foreign currency can be exchanged at local banks and Bureaux de Changes. Most major international credit cards such as American Express, Diners Club, MasterCard, Visa and their affiliates are widely accepted.

Tipping

Most restaurants do not add a service charge to bills - thus it is customary to leave a 10-15% tip. Parking and petrol station attendants should be given whatever small change you have available up to about R5. This is always appreciated, even though it may seem a small amount.

Tax

Value-added-tax (VAT) is charged on most items. Foreign tourists to South Africa can have their 14% VAT refunded provided that the value of goods purchased exceeds R250.00. VAT is refunded at the point of departure provided receipts are produced. VAT on accommodation and services will not be refunded.

Disabled Travellers: Generally speaking, our facilities for disabled visitors are improving. An increasing number of accommodation establishments have wheelchair ramps and bathroom facilities for the disabled. Almost every national park has at least one accessible chalet and many accommodation establishments have one or two wheelchair-friendly rooms. Most of our sports stadiums have accessible suites, stands or areas for wheelchairs near accessible parking as well as special toilet facilities. Most public buildings also cater for wheelchair access.

WHAT TO PACK: What you bring with you depends on what time of year you are visiting. A warm, waterproof jacket is essential all year round. Pack light, and remember the basic essentials: camera and attachments; a good pair of lightweight binoculars; adaptor plugs; toiletries including insect repellent and sunblock; medications and prescriptions; extra reading glasses; a Swiss army knife or some such (remember to pack it in your main luggage); sunhat; and notebook or journal. If you are going on safari, then it's wise to pack khaki clothing, especially if you are planning to do any hiking, as this blends into the bush better.

Electricity

South Africa's electricity supply: 220/230 volts AC 50 Hz
Exceptions: Pretoria (230 V) and Port Elizabeth (200/250 V)

Most plugs have three round pins but some plugs with two smaller pins are also found on appliances. Adaptors can be purchased but may be in short supply. US-made appliances may need a transformer.

Shopping

Most major shopping centres and malls operate 7 days a week (Monday - Saturday 09:00 to 17:00; Sunday 09:00 - 14:00) but you will find that in the smaller towns and rural areas that shops are closed on a Sunday and occasionally close for lunch between 13:00 and 14:00. Banks close at 15:30 on weekdays and 11:00 on Saturdays but most have ATMs, available 24 hours, which accept most international cards.
